We have had a lovely first week back. All the children (and staff) seemed refreshed and raring to go after our half term break in the beautiful weather.

Last half term we acknowledged Internet Safety Day—you may remember seeing things about this in the news. The children took part in presentations in assemblies and followed this up in lessons. We spend time every week trying to help children who are caught up in difficulties relating to social media friendships and see the upset this causes to both children and parents, when things go wrong (and sadly they seem to regularly). We have had conversations about Facebook and Snapchat etc and would appreciate it if you could help us with this. This also includes the younger children too. Younger children appear to now also be having mobile phones (in years 3 and 4). We teach safer internet at school but it is the access at home where the issues seem to arise, especially when the children are not supervised and social media is not monitored. Thank you for your help and support with this.

We have seen a huge reduction in the past few weeks of children arriving late to school. Many thanks for supporting us with this, it makes such a difference to all our children if their lessons are not disrupted at the start of the day by children arriving late, having to go to the office and then not knowing what they are supposed to be doing in class as they have missed the input.

A special well done to all the children in our EarlyYears who at the moment are the front runners in the year groups attendance (from September to February) at an impressive 97.2%. I think this is an amazing achievement as it is usually at this start to their education that they catch every germ that is going!

LIVE STREAMING TO STRANGERS

DAMAGE TO CONFIDENCE, BODY IMAGE & MENTAL HEALTH

Influencers, celebrities or peers use filters on the otos or videos on Instagram, it can set unrealistications of their own appearance and create feelinadequacy and low self-esteem. Children may trive for a comparable number of likes on their own.

Instagram is an image and video sharing app that allows users to share moments with the world. The app has a live streaming feature and additional add-ons, such as 'Boomerang', 'Hyperlapse' and 'Layout', which can be used to enhance their feed. Users can choose to add filters and make adjustments to their photos, such as brightness/ contrast. To make their content more 'searchable', users can include hashtags in their uploads to make them easier to find.

### **IN-APP PAYMENTS**

Instagram is rolling out in-app payments for products and services directly through the app. It will operate under the same rules as Facebook Payments, which state if you are under the age of 18, you can only use Facebook Payments with the involvement of a parent or guardian.

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## REMOVE PAYMENT **METHODS**

If you are happy for your child to have a card associated with their Instagram account, we suggest adding a PIN which needs to be entered before making a payment; this will also help prevent unauthorized purchases. This can be added in the payment settings tab.

## RESTRICT MESSAGES

If your child's account is not private, anybody can message them and reply to their stories. If they do wish to keep their account public, we strongly recommend changing the message reply settings to restrict who can message them.

### FILTER INAPROPRIATE COMMENTS

Instagram announced on 1st May that they now have an 'anti-bullying' filter on the app. The new filter hides comments containing attacks on a person's appearance or character, as well as threats to a person's well-being or health. The filter will also alert Instagram to repeated problems so they can take action on the user if necessary. This is an automatic filter, but it can be turned off. Make sure this is turned on in the apps settings.



### TURN OFF SHARING

Even though this feature will not stop Even though this feature will not stop people from taking screenshots, it will stop others being able to directly share photos and videos from a story as a message to another user. This feature can be turned off in the settings. We also recommend turning off the feature which automatically shares photos and videos from a story to a Facebook account.

## **USE A PRIVATE ACCOUNT**

By default, any image or video your child uploads to Instagram is visible to anyone. A private account means that you have to approve a request if somebody wants to follow you and only people you approve will see your posts and videos.
