After looking at England on a map and talking about it being an island, the children drew their own islands; we were so impressed with their drawings. They thought carefully about what they needed on


their island.


Last week the children had a fantastic visit from Aquatic

can find.



Welcome back Year 5!


In the past week, we have enjoyed settling back into a routine and starting new topics in our lessons!
