SATS

Year two SATS have become optional this year. As a school we have taken the decision to not sit them, as we believe they put unnecessary pressure on our youngsters and we are able to assess them effectively using our internal monitoring systems.

Year six SATS are <u>not</u> optional. Our year six pupils will sit these tests on:

- Monday 13th May (Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling—Papers 1 & 2)
- Tuesday 14th May (Reading)
- Wednesday 15th May and (Maths—Arithmetic & Maths—Reasoning paper 1)
- Thursday 16th May (Maths—Reasoning paper 2)

It is important that the children arrive at school promptly on these days to ensure they are prepared for the day ahead.

EYFS NEWS

Our Julia Donaldson topic is well underway and the children have loved learning about what being an author/ illustrator means. We launched our topic last week with the 'Paper Dolls' story and the



children created their own paper dolls to retell stories with.

The children had to find clues to guess this week's story so they visited the wildlife area and found a witches hat, cauldron and broomstick! We loved sharing the 'Room on the Broom' story and have been writing a list for our own magic potions, and exploring making them in the mud kitchen. We have been following a 'Gruffalo' theme in Forest Schools, making 'Gruffalo Crumble' and creating story maps.

We also had our first 'drawing club' session and the children used their amazing imaginations to draw what they thought the dragon's house would be like. We had caves, underground houses, castles on mountains and even some with marshmallow making machines!

YEAR ONE NEWS

This week Year 1 have been exploring the story Jasper's Beanstalk by Nick Butterworth. In English they have used the days of the week to sequence the story and have focused on spoken language to use a clear, loud voice with expression to retell the story, they did an excellent job! Following on from Jasper planting the bean in the story, we decided that in Science we would do the same! We have planted a bean and can't wait to observe the changes,

eventually these beans will be sent home to carry on growing - hopefully into a beanstalk! We are also excited to see the changes to the frogs spawn that Elodie kindly donated.

A quick reminder that on Wednesday 13th April at 2:45 you are welcome to come to our Easter bonnet parade, did you know the Easter bonnet dates back to 1870! There will be a quick chat about the phonics screening check then the children will join us for a song, cake and to show off their hats. We hope you can all make it!



YEAR TWO NEWS

Year 2 have worked very hard this week. In English, the children planned and wrote their own story called Matilda the Builder, which is based on the book 'Iggy Peck, Architect'. The children used their imagination and tried to develop their writing using, conjunctions, adverbs, adjectives and different sentence openers. In science, we have been using secondary sources to find out who Charles Macintosh was and what he invented. The children worked in pairs using fact sheets and an





iPad. We

found out lots of interesting details to write a fact file. Ask your child what Mr Macintosh invented? In music, we are learning to sing a variety of songs based on The Great Fire of London and we will be performing in front of a different class before the Easter Holidays. We have considered how we can develop our singing by thinking about our dynamics when we sing. The children are doing a wonderful job!



YEAR THREE NEWS

Year 3 have been testing their engineering skills by exploring shell structures. We made different 3D shapes from cardboard and tested to see which was strongest by adding books until the shape collapsed. The children added strengthening devices before testing again. We were shocked when a cylinder that had been strengthened was able to hold more than 30 books!

In maths we have been learning all about money and finding

change and the children have impressed us with how well they recognise and work with money. You can continue this at home by getting them to

help with adding amounts and helping you to check change.

We can't wait to welcome you all into the wildlife area for our Stone Age afternoon. Your child is bringing home an invitation today and we have lots of exciting activities planned.



YEAR FOUR NEWS

Year 4 have had the best couple of weeks!

In English, we have been busy creating some informative leaflets on Yorkshire's Three Peaks. These are looking so eye-catching but also have lots of useful information in them. Why don't you ask

your child about the Ingleborough myth about a hidden German spy...?

We have been enjoying learning about volcanoes in Geography. The children are so enthusiastic about this topic and we can't wait to continue with it! We are all confident now on the parts of a volcano as well as where and how they are formed. We are going to begin our case study on the Icelandic volcano of '<u>Eyjafjallajökull'</u> soon. Can you pronounce it?

They created some amazing sculptures and learnt lots about our key artist, Barbara Hepworth. We can't wait to start making our own clay sculptures in school!

In year 5, we have been working really hard in maths, finding equivalent fractions and simplifying fractions. This has meant we have needed to use our knowledge of times table facts a lot! In PE, we have been enjoying our tennis sessions where we have working on our forehand and backhand shots and then our volleys. We have been so impressed by the fabulous teamwork we have



seen. We are really looking forward to our visit to the mosque next week as we have been thinking carefully about places of worship in our RE lessons. Don't forget to bring a packed lunch and a drink.
