The theme for Anti-Bullying Week has the tag-line 'All Different, All Equal' and will promote difference and equality in schools.


The idea is to help children and young people celebrate what makes them, and others, unique and help them understand why it's important that every child feels included in school and able to be themselves without the fear of bullying.

Andy Day — star of children's TV - has joined forces with the Anti-Bullying Alliance to help them launch 'Odd Sock Day for Anti-Bullying Week' which encourages primary schools and parents all over the UK to encourage young children to wear odd socks for the day and celebrate their uniqueness.

The importance of Andy's message that an understanding of individuality at an early age can help prevent bullying later in life is echoed by the Anti-Bullying Alliance.

Here at Bedale Primary School, we will be holding our very own 'Odd Socks Day' on Monday 13th November to help us launch Anti-Bullying Week. The children will all be shown Andy's video of his song 'Unique' during Collective Worship. Classes will be following this up with activities based around bullying throughout the week.

We hope the beans are growing well and the children are enjoying watching them grow. We have been


