Year 5 News In year 5, we have been writing our own version of 'The Wild Wood' from The Wind in the Willows. The children then had the opportunity to record their stories as a podcast which they thoroughly enjoyed! In maths, we have been working on statistics and have been drawing our own graphs and reading from timetables.

With this week being anti-bullying week, we have looked at how we can all make a choice in the fight against bullying, for example, I choose to include others in my games.

We've had a gloriously gory couple of weeks in Year 6! From writing super explanations of the Ancient Maya game of Poly A. Tok (where the loging team also logt their heads \_ literally

# MUSIC IN SCHOOL

This year I have the great privilege of delivering music lessons to most classes across the school. The children have been enthusiastic and eager to learn new vocabulary, skills and find out more about a style of music. They have had determination to keep practising a tricky part of the music and I have been amazed at how many children have started to understand how to read the notation. During these challenging times music can be a great help for our mental wellbeing, and it has been such a joy to see so many happy faces during music lessons.

We made the decision as a school not to use recorders as a class instrument this year, due to COVID, but instead we have purchased a new class set of glockenspiels which we are then able to clean in between each session so that it is safe. I think the children would agree that these instruments have been a great success and learning to play them, has been very enjoyable.

More children this year are also participating in private music lessons, including flute, piano, guitar and violin. We have waiting lists for guitar and piano, however there are a few spaces after Christmas for flute and violin.
