

The Early Years children have been learning all about Julia Donaldson books over the last few weeks. Their work has been fantastic both at home and at school. In English, the children have worked so hard on capital letters and lower case cursive letters the last couple of weeks. We are delighted to see such progress with this. Rhyming words have come on well too and the high frequency tricky word work has been fantastic.

In Maths, the part whole method has been very good and we can see children really understanding that there are different ways to make up the numbers.

We have been super impressed with all of your topic work and the way you have crafted and painted and really produced some lovely pieces. We know how much work this takes!

Thank you to those families who have joined in with the live sessions. These have been fun and a good opportunity for the children to see each other and listen to a story or take part in an activity.

Next week we are thinking about healthy living and the week after we are learning about birds and taking part in a national project. Thank you again for all of your time and support over the last few weeks.

Year one have been busy at home finding out about different plants.

They made wonderful collages from natural materials and went out to spot different deciduous and evergreen trees in the local area. With Mr McHugh they have been using the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and he has been very impressed by their use of adjectives in their writing. It has been great to see so many children at our live sessions. We have done some step-by-step drawing in an online art class, a scavenger hunt using adjectives and met each other's pets.



Year 4 News
