BEDALE GOVERNING BODY

Our Governors are meeting next week to discuss our return to school and our remote learning provision. It has been reassuring to hear how well our pupils have done despite such challenges. With regard to our Governing Body, there have been some changes and I thought it would be useful for them to introduce themselves to you as follows:

Kate Loughlin I started as a Parent Governor in 2014 when both my children were at Bedale Primary School and have been Chair of Governors since 2019. I became a Governor as I wanted to work with the school to ensure all children are given the opportunity to reach their maximum potential. It has been a very rewarding role and has been fabulous to see the school continue to grow and develop it's ethos of 'Learning and Caring Together' — Perseverance, Compassion and Friendship and developing opportunities for the children not just academic but also life skills and experiences.

I am the subject lead Governor for English and Computing and meet with the members of staff responsible for these subjects on a regular basis to keep up to date on developments within the subjects. I am also the designated Governor for Safeguarding and Child Protection.
