E Safety

Unfortunately, we are having to deal with incidents in school where pupils have sent inappropriate messages on their mobiles to other pupils. Please, please check your child's phone regularly. Also it has been brought to my attention by staff that pupils as young as Year 2 are playing Fortnite. I believe this is a game suitable for 12 years and upwards so it not suitable for primary aged pupils. New apps and websites appear all the time as well as gaining (or losing) popularity. O2 and NSPCC's Net Aware website has a very useful guide to many of these, giving a safety rating based on safety features; privacy and location; reporting and blocking; content. They also provide advice on age restrictions and links to setting up parental controls. Visit www.net-aware.org.uk/networks/ to review the websites, apps and networks your family use.
