EYFS NEWS

We have been so proud of how well the children have settled back into school after their Christmas holiday. This term we are learning all about the Chinese culture. We have been looking at how people in China celebrate New Year and comparing it to our New Year celebrations. We found China and England on a map, and thought about how we could travel to China.

After looking at England on a map and talking about it being an island, the children drew their own islands, we were so impressed with their drawings. They thought carefully about what they needed on their island.

Following on from our work on The Magic Paintbrush, they have painted things that they think would be helpful to people. They were so compassionate and thoughtful; thinking really hard about other people and what they might need.

In PE we have been practising traditional Chinese dancing with silk scarves.

YEAR 1 NEWS

The children have been enjoying our new topic 'What a wonderful World' and have liked exploring animal groups in science, well done to all those who completed the animal fact file posters for homework, they look amazing!

This week in English we had a big shock to learn that our animal puppets for our English story 'Monkey Puzzle' by Julia Donaldson had gone missing! The children created some super lost posters using adjectives to describe which animals were missing. We displayed the posters around school in hope that some of the other children and teachers would find them, luckily, they came back to Year One safe and sound.

We enjoyed a very interesting collective worship lead by the Peer Mentor team, in which they spoke to us about being healthy.

This half term in DT we will be exploring foods that are farmed, grown and caught. It would be great if at home if you encouraged your child to try a range of fruits ready for our upcoming DT lessons.

YEAR 2 NEWS

The children have all come back so well and have settled down to the new term eager to work hard, which has been lovely to see. We have started our new theme, 'The Great Fire of London' and the children have really enjoyed the history of how this started and what happened. Everyone has done so well writing a news report pretending we are reporting live from London as the fire is happening and reading it aloud like a real-life news reporter to the class. We are really proud of them all.

YEAR 3 NEWS

Multiplication and division is our focus in maths and we are continuing to work hard to learn our times tables.


Mr Holme's class have started their PE sessions at High School on a Monday and Mrs York and Sawyer's class will commence with their sessions after the half term.

Although it's only January, our thoughts start to turn to SATs during this term and getting ready to show how amazing we are when these come around at the start of May. It's been great to see everyone who has started attending before and after-school groups really getting stuck in and working hard.

We've also begun working on our theme for the half term of climate change, thinking about how our actions impact on the planet. Ask your child to explain "The Greenhouse Effect" – hopefully they all can now.

PROCEDURES IN THE EVENT OF THE ENFORCED CLOSURE OF SCHOOL DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS

Before a decision is made whether school should open or not (enforced closure), consideration should be given to:

- The distance that staff have to travel
- Road/traffic conditions
- Local conditions for staff/pupils and parents who travel on foot.

The Head teacher will make a decision based on the outcome of the above consultation bearing in mind the following options:

- Closure for the full day
- Late opening e.g. at 10.00am to allow time for staff to arrive safely

If the school is to close

Parents/carers will be alerted to the closure via the Teachers 2 Parents text messaging service as well as the school's Facebook page.

The closure will be recorded on the school website (www.bedaleprimaryschool.co.uk).

The media (local radio stations) will be utilised to broadcast the details if required.

The school will make all practicable efforts to keep parents/carers informed as to the situation with the school during adverse weather conditions, as we appreciate that such conditions and the uncertainty places very considerable difficulties upon parents/carers. However, parents/carers are expected to regularly check the website and the radio broadcasts when it is clear that a closure is a possibility.

The school appreciates that during bad weather children may arrive later than normal; parents/carers should endeavour to contact the school to let them know they are on their way if they are likely to be delayed.

The Head teacher will ensure that should the school open the provision of staffing in place is in accordance with Health and Safety legislation, bearing in mind pupil/teacher ratios, job descriptions and correct procedures for staff covering other classes, playtime arrangements, heating and lunchtime provision.
