This week we went on our first school trip to Big Sheep Little Cow to learn more about animals and their life cycles. We walked from school to the farm on a beautiful sunny morning. As we went around the farm we were able to feed the baby lambs with milk bottles, brush Shetland ponies, stroke Guinea pigs, turtles and rabbits. We were thrilled to see so many animals and learn so many new facts. Also during our visit we got to visit the play barn, electric bikes and even rode on the barrel ride around the field. On a different note a little reminder to say that we are now doing PE outside so your child will need outside trainers in their PE kit as they will be on the field.










YEAR 1 NEWS

We have started our new theme of explorers and have been finding out about modern explorer Ellen MacCarthur. In writing, we have written about different landscapes that we might want to explore and




have started our new text of The Great Explorer by helping the main character Tom with his packing list. Thank you for your wonderful writing for homework.

In science, we have started our new topic on forces. Last week, we experimented with the Newton meters to measure the force acting upon each object which we really enjoyed! In art we have started to produce our own collagraphs (a collage of materials of various textures glued on to a printing plate). Next week, we will paint our collagraphs and print

onto paper. In our writing, the children have been coming up with some silly explanations on how a steam engine works based on the book "Until I met Dudley" by Roger McGough. Why not ask how it works?

On Wednesday 11th May, year 5 will be heading over to the high school for a maths enrichment day which sounds like lots of fun. The children will need a packed lunch, drink and coat.
