Over the past two years we have tried to be flexible for those of you who have had holidays rearranged due to cancellations in Covid, but these now should have all been taken. There will be no authorised absence for holidays now unless exceptional circumstances are agreed as in the systems before Covid hit us. Children have missed a significant amount of their learning and they have worked hard this year to catch up and fill the gaps. Chunks of absence for holidays will not be helpful. The Local Authority has gone back to issuing fines for holidays taken in term time that are unauthorised.

It is our duty to work together to ensure the children get a good education and we are keen to support you and them to improve attendance.

#### SCHOOL COUNCIL

This year we have organized our School Council into three groups. One group will coordinate school initiatives and fundraising. This could include raising money for equipment for our children or making changes within the school in conjunction with Mrs Turnbull.
