"It was so yummy, I ate it all. I hope Mummy cooks it at home soon" - Emily K-M




Thank you for your continued support with homework on Google Classroom and reading at home. The children are doing really well with their sounds and tricky words.

"Our Art lessons in school helped us today because we have used watercolours before."


"My art techniques have improved!"

everyone's opinions. The children were able to produce their final reports after analysing these. We hope everyone has a lovely half term, enjoying some well-deserved rest after all your hard work!




YEAR 5 NEWS
