

## EYFS NEWS

We have been so impressed with how the children have returned to school this week and how hard they have been working. This week we have been reading the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. We have enjoyed dressing up as the different characters to act out the story and using the repeated story language that is used. In the making area we have made our own houses and writing a list of the different things that we would want in our house.

Over the Easter holidays, our tadpoles have grown !! We couldn't believe how big they had become and the children were very excited to see how they have changed.

## YEAR ONE NEWS

Year 1 have settled back brilliantly after a lovely Easter break; the children have loved preparing for our sunflower competition this week. Thank you to all those who came to our maths workshop yesterday, if you weren't able to make it, please see Google Classroom for all information.

In English they have created a set of instructions on how to grow a sunflower, using 'bossy verbs' and have painted and drawn some fabulous sunflower pictures. Last term in maths the children learnt about measure, they can now use the key language of taller and shorter and how to use a ruler to measure the growth of their sunflower over the next term, the tallest flower will win a prize at the end of the year so ready, set, grow!

A quick reminder that spellings will now be tested on a Friday and new spellings will still be set on a Friday morning. PE days are now Monday - outside, and Friday - inside, please ensure your child has their PE in school for these days.



## YEAR TWO NEWS

What a fantastic first week back for Year 2! We started the week with Box2Bfit with Dave, where the children worked so hard at circuits and their boxing techniques. They showed great perseverance. To kick start our topic 'Come Fly with Me' we've introduced the story of 'Emma Jane's Aeroplane'. Ask your child to retell this story to you and the places she visits. Then over the next two weeks, the children will be writing their own fantasy narratives and going on their own adventures around the world. In science, we've started our new topic 'living things and their habitats', looking at living things or objects that are alive, have never been alive and things that are dead with the help of MRS GREN and the 7 living processes to help us explain.



## YEAR THREE NEWS

Firstly, thank you to all the parents, grandparents and carers who came to the Stone Age events. It was fantastic to see so many of you working in our woodland area with your children and we hope you had fun despite the wet weather.

In Science we have finished our rocks and soils work by conducting an investigation in to how much water different soils absorb. We are excited to move on to learning more about plants in the next half term. Look out for a letter in the next few weeks about our visit to the Himalayan Gardens.

This week the children have made Stone Age houses as part of the Design and Technology project looking at shell structures and how you can strengthen them. They thought carefully about what they could add to make them look realistic and to stop them from falling down!

We were very impressed with the children's stamina and skills in our Box2B fit session. We are now swimming every Friday morning so please don't forget to send their kit with them every week.



## YEAR FOUR NEWS

Year 4 have had a brilliant start to the Summer term! We have enjoyed lots of exciting things this week, including the Box 2 be fit workshop, a visit from two Rally car drivers, and beginning our brand new topics!



The children have shown off their throwing and catching skills when practising skills for rounders. We definitely have some budding fielders in the class!



We are emerging ourselves in all things Anglo-Saxon and Viking. We have been learning about how the Anglo-Saxons would have lived, worked, and invaded.


